ANY MORE vs ANYMORE

Any more = Any additional or any further.

- I don't need any more clothes.

Any more = No longer; (usually used with a negative)

- Alice doesn't live here anymore.

ANYONE vs ANY ONE

Anyone = Any person.

- Has anyone seen my wallet?

Any one = It Refers to a single item or person within a specific group.

- You can choose any one of these books. (a specific book from a group)

ANYWAY vs ANY WAY

Anyway = Used as a support to previous statement or a statement to come.

- Anyway, there is another factor to consider.

Any way : Any manner/method or any path

- Is there any way I can make amends for ruining your party? (=any manner)
- If you don't know where you're going, any way will take you there. (= any path)

EVERYDAY vs EVERY DAY

Everyday = Found in the ordinary course of events

- Change is a part of everyday life in business.

Every day = Each day .

- I go to school every day.

EVERYONE vs EVERY ONE

Everyone = Everybody (All the people)

- Everyone was trying to find a place to park.

Every one = Each individual member of a group (+ of)

- I have many friends. Every one is dear to me.
- Every one of the phones has a camera.

SOMETIME vs SOME TIME vs SOMETIMES

Sometime = At some indefinite or unstated time.

- Everything has to end sometime.

Some time = A period of time.

- It will take some time for us to build a team.

Sometimes = On some occasions but not always or often.

- I sometimes see him in the street.
