

## DO YOU / WOULD YOU







#### DO YOU MIND vs WOULD YOU MIND

We use "Do you mind / Would you mind? to make a request politely, we may be anticipating possible objections:

- Would you mind if I put off talking to John until tomorrow?
- Do you mind if I take a piece of cake?

Do you mind/Would you mind are commonly followed by a gerund (ing)

✓ Do you mind doing the dishes? X Do you mind to do the dishes?

Note the difference between:

Would/do you mind...? vs Would/do you mind me/my...?

• Would you mind turning the radio down a little?

(= I want you to do it)

• Would you mind me/my turning the radio down a little?

(= I want to do it)

### **DO YOU MIND - STRUCTURE**

DO YOU MIND IF + SUBJECT + VERB (present tense)

Do you mind if I borrow your pen?

DO YOU MIND ME/MY + verb (gerund - ing)

Do you mind me/my turning on the light?

#### **WOULD YOU MIND - STRUCTURE**

WOULD YOU MIND IF + SUBJECT + VERB (past tense)

• Would you mind if I borrowed you car tomorrow?

WOULD YOU MIND ME/MY + verb (gerund - ing)

Would you mind me/my borrowing your car tomorrow?

# ANSWERS TO "DO YOU MIND...?" / "WOULD YOU MIND...?":

- Do you mind if I smoke? No, I don't mind. = I allow you to do that.
- Do you mind if I smoke? Yes, I do mind. = I don't allow you to do that. The last answer is a bit impolite. It'd be better to use "I'd rather you didn't".
