Ah, there they are. there it is : used to express the fact that you cannot change a situation so you must accept it: It's not really fair on the others, but there it is. 	 used when explaining or showing something to somebody You switch on, push in the DVD and there you are! used when you think you have proved to someone that what you are telling them is right There you are! I told you it was easy! used when you are giving something to someone: Do you want a tissue? There you are. There you are—that'll be £3.80, please.
THERE YOU GO	THERE YOU GO AGAIN
 used when you are giving someone something that they have asked for or that they have just bought A: 'Can I have another slice?' B: 'There you go.' used to express the fact that you cannot change a situation so you must accept it: There you go—that's what they're like. We didn't win the competition, but there you go - we can always try again next year. used to mean "I told you so": There you go - I knew you'd forget if you didn't write it down. There you go - I told you you'd win! 	 used when someone has just said or done the same annoying thing that they have often said or done before There you go again, blaming everything on me! There they go again, making trouble. There you go again—jumping to conclusions.
